We had a number of apologises for absence for our October meeting, but had enough Councillors to make it happen. We did have lots to discuss, most of it was ongoing items which haven't yet reached a conclusion and cannot be taken off the agenda. Whilst we can 'archive' some of the agenda items, they are generally replaced with something new. It was a good productive meeting, which lasted 1 hour and 40 minutes.

Here is a brief summary of what was discussed.

The following are applications made to Essex Highways and we are awaiting their decision.

Church Road additional parking and traffic calming. Long Gardens – speeding. Speed Indicator Device central to the village.

We have applied to Highways for the 30 mph limit to be extended along Old Road and Park Road

We have applied to our County Councillor to have 'Beware of Horse' signs at the three entrance points into our village.

We have applied to our County Councillor to have a 'Unsuitable for Heavy Vehicles' sign on Old Road at the A131 junction.

Old Road.

We have concerns over the volume and type of traffic that use this road and we discussed ways of how to alleviate the issue. This is an historic narrow lane with vehicles unable to pass each other and there are risks to walkers and damage being done to the verges. The signpost to Wickham from the A131 was removed some years ago, but Sat-Nav still insists on sending all sorts of vehicles down that road.

Suggestions to try to limit the flow of traffic could be a one-way system?? We would like your thoughts and anything we would propose to Highways would follow a public consultation.

Parked Vehicles along School Road.

The issue with over parking on School Road seems to have been resolved, but we would ask residents to park responsibly in the village, particularly near junctions.

Queens Platinum Jubilee Beacon.

We agreed to have a beacon to join the 1500 around the country to be lit on the 2nd June 2022. The cost will be discussed at the November meeting and also the location. Angela Johnstone will be leading the project.

Telephone Box.

We reported several months ago to BT that the telephone in the kiosk was faulty and have been chasing it ever since. We don't want to lose this facility and we certainly don't want to lose our box, which we believe has been here since the 1950's.

Most unused boxes are turned into libraries and in some case, are removed altogether, (shame Bulmer lost theirs). When it is up and running, please use it occasional to keep it going and for those who haven't use one for a while, it no longer costs 4d and you don't have to press button 'A' or 'B'!

Fireworks on the Green - Trafalgar Night

This event will not take place this year owing to concerns regarding social distancing.

Replacing Defibrillator Battery.

The battery has reached the end of its life and needs to be replaced in October at a cost of £282.00 incl.

When the defibrillator was first installed some 6-years ago, the Parish Council made the decision that it would be solely responsible for its maintenance and replacement parts (pads and battery). Unlike neighbouring parishes, we felt that it would be unfair to ask for donations towards its upkeep on the basis that everyone in the village, including of course visitors, would have access to the defibrillator. Also, any fund raising we did, would compete with that of the Church and Village Hall.
