Highways.

All the concerns and requests we have made to Essex Highways are still ongoing, but we do regularly ask them for updates, these include:

Church Road - additional parking. A131 Long Gardens - traffic calming. Speed Indicator Device. Park Road - 30mph zone extension. 'Beware of Horses' signs. Old Road - Erosion to verges.

Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee.

We have agreed to hire a beacon for the event for the 2nd. June 2022 and if it proves popular, we will consider a permanent one for the future. No doubt there will be other forms of events taking place, so please keep an eye on Look Out notifications.

Christmas Lights Switch-On.

Our lights were switched on by two of our newest and youngest residents, Bertie and Kit Brooking. What a fantastic evening we had with over 70 residents, including 14 children, joining in. Precept/ Budget 2022/2023.

We have now set our budget for the next financial year and have also set our Precept (local tax). The precept will have to increase by just 3%, equivalent to around 5-pence per week per household, to ensure that our income doesn't exceed our expenditure.

For several years now our expenditure has exceeded our income and we have therefore had to draw on reserves, but in this coming financial period we are aiming not to draw on reserves. We are pleased to say the maintenance of the village is in good order and we don't have any projects planned.
