If a member of the public/landowner/householder becomes verbally or physically abusive leave the area and refer to them to the Chair or Vice Chair of the Parish Council. Contact the police for advice	Consider if it is appropriate to undertake lone working. Arrange for an additional person to accompany when litter picking. Members of the Public Volunteers from Community Groups Adverse weather to include; Snow/Ice/Rain/Wind Chill/Fog/Water Spray/ Hot Weather/Low Sun/Bad Light	Protective clothing must be worn, gloves, long trousers, long sleeve shirt and a suitable hat to protect the head from the sun. Suitable sunglasses/eye protection.  Waterproof clothing during wet weather. Warm clothing during cold weather. Wear layers rather than thick jumpers/coats. Wear suitable warm gloves/hats. Suitable footwear eg wellies/protective boots. Carry bottles of water. Take regular breaks in the shade.
